

PROPOSALS FOR A NEW SOLAR FARM ON LAND AT ASHBY ST LEDGERS



Elgin would like to invite you to an in-person exhibition at Ashby St Ledgers Village Hall to view and comment on plans for a new solar farm on land between the A361 and Daventry Road near Ashby St Ledgers.

Ashby St Ledgers solar farm will be capable of generating 35MW of electricity, enough to power approximately 15,000 homes.

Ashby St Ledgers solar farm will contribute to West Northamptonshire Council's climate commitments, decarbonising the local energy supply, reducing bills, and improving the UK's energy security.



The proposals at a glance

- 35MW solar farm on land off Welton Road, Ashby St Ledgers
- After 45 years the site will be decommissioned and reinstated
- Dual use – 95% of the land can be used for sheep farming
- A community benefit fund is available to support local initiatives
- £2.5m generated in business rates over the lifetime of the project

Your view matters

Elgin is committed to meaningful community engagement. We want to hear the views of the local community before we submit a planning application. Following feedback from the community Elgin is hosting a hybrid exhibition for key local stakeholders and the wider community, which will assist in shaping the final application to be submitted to West Northamptonshire Council.

Therefore, we will be hosting an in-person public exhibition event and a virtual exhibition.

The public exhibition will be held at **Ashby St Ledgers Village Hall, Rugby, CV23 8UN** on **Tuesday 17 June 2025** between **3pm to 7pm**.
